

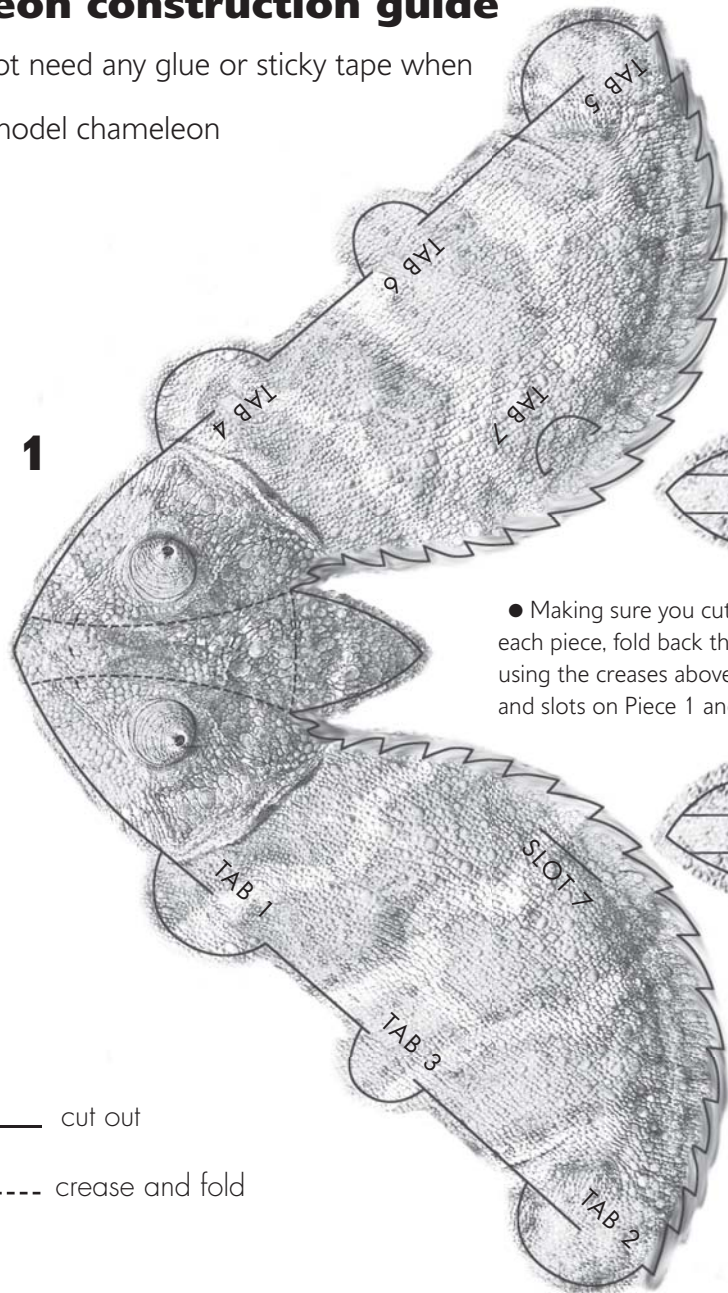
## Chameleon model

# Chameleon construction guide

You should not need any glue or sticky tape when making this model chameleon

## Piece 1



● Making sure you cut out the tabs and slots on each piece, fold back the head and body (Piece 1) using the creases above the eyes. Then align the tabs and slots on Piece 1 and Piece 2, and slot together.

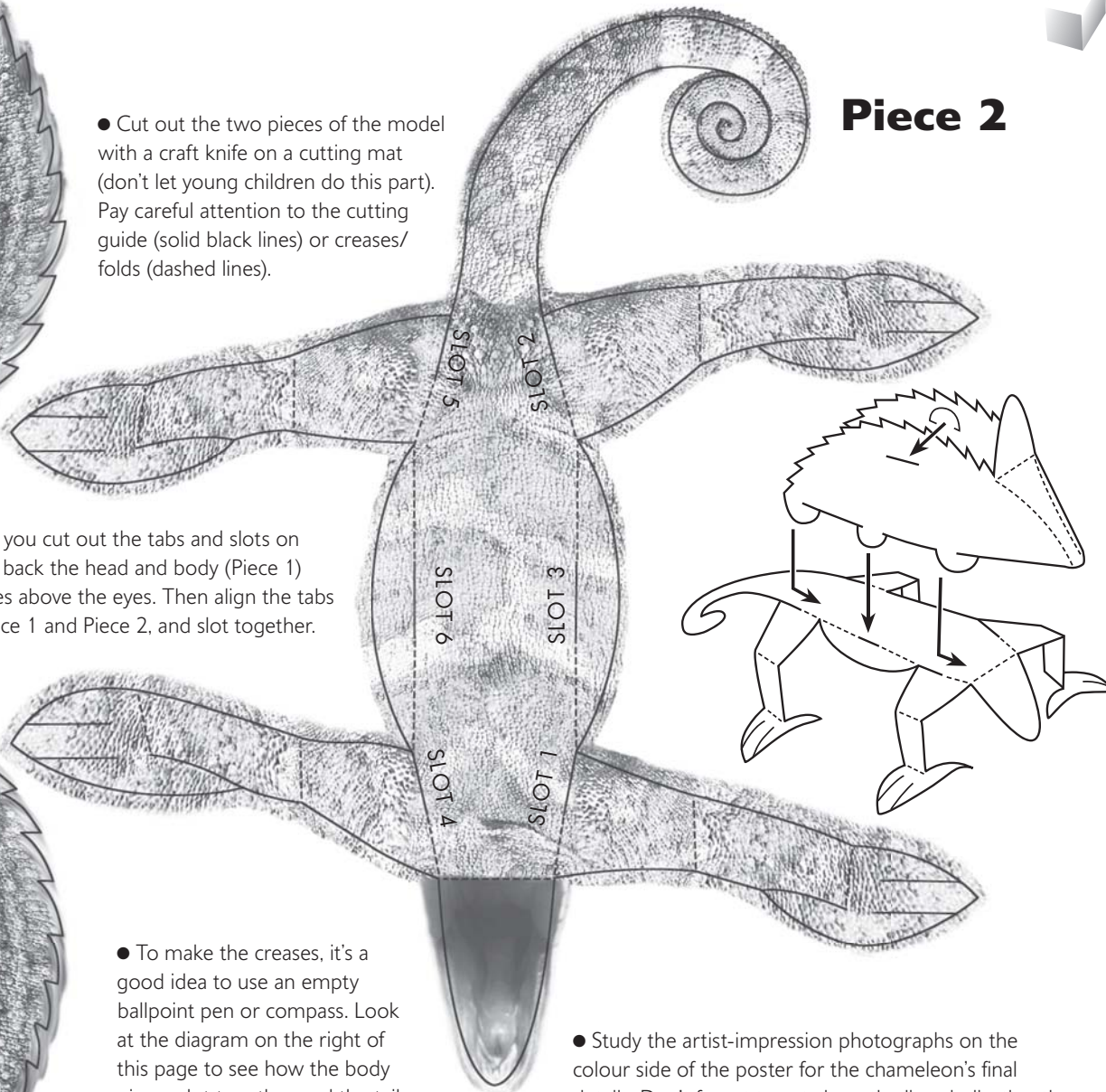
**Key:**

----- crease and fold

● Cut out the two pieces of the model with a craft knife on a cutting mat (don't let young children do this part). Pay careful attention to the cutting guide (solid black lines) or creases/folds (dashed lines).

## Piece 2



● To make the creases, it's a good idea to use an empty ballpoint pen or compass. Look at the diagram on the right of this page to see how the body pieces slot together and the tail, mouth and legs fold down.

● Study the artist-impression photographs on the colour side of the poster for the chameleon's final details. Don't forget to cut along the lines indicating the toes and opposable thumbs and curl them realistically.
