ANN: 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번 대화를 듣고, 여자의 마지막 말에 대한 남자의 응답으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Alex, have you finished the report for history class?

M: Not yet. And I doubt I'll be able to finish it by tomorrow.

W: Don't you know the due date has been pushed back to next Monday?

M: Have you seen the notice for the student dormitory next year?

W: You look better than ever these days. What's your secret?

However, many people feel uncomfortable when dogs run free in public. That's why the new law was passed requiring dog owners to put their dogs on a leash at all times in public places. The problem is that people don't obey the new law or even know it exists. They still walk their dogs in parks and streets without leashes and nobody enforces the law. I strongly believe the law regarding dogs without leashes should be more strictly enforced for the safety of our community.

5번 대화를 듣고, 남자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hey, Jenny! You're here early today.

W: I came in early because I have to leave early. I have an appointment with my doctor this afternoon.

M: You seem to make good use of this new flexible working-hour system.

They usually feed on squid or fish, and they live well over fifty years. They nest on remote islands laying a single egg in a breeding season. Now, let's take a look at how they soar and glide on the winds for thousands of kilometers across oceans without rest.
